in pursuance of justice. Against all odds, he ensured that the remains of genocide victims are brought back to the mother land. Against all odds, he fought and championed the call for the repatriation of the Ovaherero who fled to Botswana during the genocide era.

CAPITAL AND OPERATIONAL BUDGET FOR THE 2014/2015 FINANCIAL YEAR

The main objective of the Municipality of Swakopmund is to maintain the rendering of quality services of acceptable standards to the entire community of Swakopmund. For the past years, efficient service delivery to the residents of Swakopmund has become a challenging task to manage effectively as it has to be supported by sufficient financial resources.

The Swakopmund Municipality wants to improve on service delivery and to maintain and upgrade infrastructure to accomplish Council's approved strategic plan, which is currently on track and most projects are almost completed. Below is a summary of both the capital and operational budgets for the 2014/2015 financial year, approved by Council on 24 April 2014.

1. Capital Budget (approved N\$ 175 331 380.00) :

The capital budget amounts to N\$ 175 million. The challenge is to achieve the objective with the resources currently available in Council's investment and current accounts, and anticipated property sale transactions expected to generate revenue in excess of N\$ 90 million.

The projects included in the capital budget are as follows:

1.1 Formalization of DRC informal area – N\$ 24.2 million

This is Council's contribution towards formalization of the DRC informal area. Additional funds will be availed to Council by Central Government under the Mass Housing initiative.

1.2 Re-location of midblock sewerage system – Mondesa/Tamariskia – N\$8.5 million

Mondesa currently experiences regular sewerage blockages which does not reflect the living standard Council wants to provide for its inhabitants. Council will therefore replace the midblock system, with one located in the streets as with all Mondesa suburbs.

1.3 Provision of serviced land – Installation of services for Block 2 Tamariskia – N\$ 19.4 million

This provision is aimed at installing services for Block 2 in Tamariskia to sell the erven available to the public. The remaining part of the funds will be allocated towards future planning of serviced land for further development of our town.

1.4 Streets – N\$35.8 million

This provision is for the resurfacing of streets and roads in Swakopmund. Council has taken up the initiative to provide the required material and Local Contractors are appointed to provide the required labour.



1.5 Traffic Services – N\$ 1.7 million

The above provision will be utilized to replace current old fleet of the traffic section which is aimed at improving traffic related services.

1.6 Public Buildings – N\$ 19.5 million

This allocation is for the completion of the Multi-Purpose centre, renovations to the Museum and Woermann House building and many other buildings of Council.



1.7 Cleansing Section – N\$ 11.7 million

To improve on the refuse removal service, rehabilitate the old dump site, to purchase a new skip container truck and purchase bins for the new extensions of our town.



1.8 Sewerage Works : N\$ 39 million

Above funding is earmarked to complete the new effluent purified reservoir and also expand effluent water supply to the rest of the town, to develop public open spaces and develop and enhance of our parks and gardens. An additional Jetvat truck will also be purchased for sewerage related blockages in our town.



1.9 Business and Market Malls – N\$ 11.2 million

As per our strategic plan, N\$ 7million has been budgeted for the construction of the industrial park of which phase 1 will cater for Small and Medium Enterprises.

2. Operational Budget (approved N\$ 2 481 300.00)

The operational budget reflecting a deficit of N\$ 2 481 310.00 comprises of 19 new positions, aimed at improving service delivery.

2.1 Tariffs

NamWater will implement tariff increases on the bulk purchase price for water applicable to Council. The effect hereof is not yet known and Council will be informed once this information is available. Therefore service related tariffs will be increased as follows:

Assessment rates – 10 %

Water only the staggered tariffs as set below:

9m³-30 m³ - 5%

30m³-60m³ - 7.5%

60 m³ and above – 7.5%

Sewerage – 20%

Refuse removal – 10%

Sport facilities & Town Halls – 10%

Tourism (Bungalows) – 10-12%

Council will keep the special water basic tariff relevant to the Senior Citizens at the current tariff of N\$25.00 per month which is inclusive of the 8 m³ water.

Council expresses its heartfelt appreciation to the entire staff of Swakopmund Municipality who have contributed towards the tabling of the budget and to the inhabitants of our town and all investors.



RESIDENTIAL ERVEN FOR SALE AT EXTENSION 15, SWAKOPMUND

The Ministry of Regional and Local Government, Housing and Rural Development granted approval for the sale of single residential erven located in Extension 15 by private transaction at fixed purchase prices.

1. Offers:

Offers were invited and accepted since 2 May 2014 from prospective purchasers. **The offer stating the full name and address of the offeror, the erf number and the purchase price** must be in writing and must be hand delivered in person by the offeror to the Municipal Head Office, Property Section.

Offers will be dealt with on the day they are received at the Municipal offices.

No applications via e-mail or fax will be accepted and no reservation of any erf will be entertained.

- A formal written guarantee from a banking institution securing the purchase price for a specific erf (state the erf number).

- Should a purchaser elect to pay cash, the purchase price must be transferred into Council's bank account and proof of payment must be attached to the written offer
- Marriage Certificate and copy of your spouse's ID as well as ante nuptial contract in the case of being married out of community of property.
- If the offer is made on behalf of a legal entity, the registration documentation in addition to the abovementioned documents.

Offers without the above attachments are incomplete and will not be considered.

4. Conditions:

- Only one erf per purchaser / legal entity will be considered (Council regards married couples as one entity irrespective of the marital regime).
- No offers by proxy will be accepted, the prospective purchaser is required to hand deliver the offer in person.
- The property will only be transferred into the name of the purchaser appearing on the offer and no negotiations will be entered into (the nomination of a purchaser is not allowed).
- Transfer must be registered within 120 days from date of sale; failing which Council will have the option to cancel the sale.
- The erven are sold voetstoots and offers may not be less than the suggested price.

DONATION OF A COMPUTER TO THE MONDESA CHARGE OFFICE

Council donated a Touch Screen Computer to the Mondesa Charge office. The Station Commander of the Mondesa Police Station, Inspector E Nghaamwa received the computer on 17 April 2014 on behalf of the Erongo Regional Commander, Commissioner S //Hoebeg.

At the handover, ceremony, Inspector E Nghaamwa indicated that the computer will be delivered to the Regional Office in Walvisbay where a programme will be installed for processing of "Police Motor Vehicle Clearance Certificates" thereafter it will be brought back to Swakopmund. He also stated that the computer will help the region to improve their services by enabling them to process and capture data faster and also the tracing of unregistered vehicles.

The new office where these certificates can be issued will open during August 2014 at the Mondesa Charge Office. It will no longer be necessary for the Swakopmund residents to travel to Walvisbay and wait in long queues in order to obtain their Police Motor Vehicle Clearance Certificate in the future.

PROJECT SHINE 2014

Project Shine kicked off on 5 June 2014 "World Environment Day". The project has been running successfully for the past 6 years with the financial support of its sponsors like Namibia Breweries Limited, NACOMA Project, Bannerman Resources and Rossing Uranium Ltd. This year, Hafeni Tours and Walvis Bay Municipality are the new sponsors that joined the project.

Project Shine is aimed at preserving the environment by having annual clean-up campaigns and creative competition named "My Trash My Treasure". The first Green Environmental Project was launched on World Environmental Day, 5 June 2014 by the Erongo Regional Governor Honorable Cleophas Mutjavikua. He stated that "there is a need to encourage future leaders to be naturally curious and open to learning about nature, and a need to constantly create opportunities to help children bond with nature and learn about the environment". The project is aimed at promoting environmental conservation through environmental education and eco-tourism. THREE NEW PRIMARY HEALTH CARE CLINICS OPENED IN SWAKOPMUND

The following three Primary health care clinics were inaugurated on 12 May 2014 by Dr Richard Nchabi Kamwi, Minister of Health and Social Services:

- * Mondesa Clinic
- * DRC Clinic (Container to Clinic)
- * Tamariskia Anti-Retroviral Therapy (ART) clinic

The community of Swakopmund has been served by only one Primary health care clinic situated in Tamariskia, which is 5 km away from the DRC and some areas in Mondesa.

The new health facilities in Mondesa and DRC will increase access to health care services for the community of Swakopmund and also reduce the distance and costs of travelling to the health facilities especially for expectant women.

The Mondesa clinic provides all the Primary Health Care services, i.e. screening and treatment of minor ailments, family planning, antenatal care, postnatal care, HIV counseling and testing, immunization, growth monitoring, health education and health promotion.

A mother and child container clinic is in DRC for maternal and child health care services. Pregnant women from the DRC are advised to attend their antenatal care sessions. The staff of the DRC clinic have a green garden behind the containers where vegetables are grown and donated to the expecting mothers for nourishment.

The Tamariskia Anti-Retroviral Therapy clinic was established primarily as part of efforts to scale up HIV and AIDS care and treatment. One of the key services in the prevention of HIV infection is prevention of mother-to-

child transmission. The clinic will strengthen the HIV care in the district and will help foster retention of these patients in the health system, improve treatment and provide the much needed follow-up. Additionally it will also provide HIV counseling and testing therefore Swakopmunders are encouraged to go for HIV counseling and testing to ensure the earliest possible access to HIV treatment.

Dr R Kamwi handed over the Nurses Pledge to all the nursing staff of the clinics so that they remind themselves of the oath they took.

He also urges the residents of Swakopmund to take advantage of this investment and make full use of the health facilities.

Skips or dumpsters are large open-topped waste containers designed for loading onto a special type of lorry.

Skips are commonly used to hold loads of construction and demolition waste or other waste and litter types. The construction debris may originate from a building, renovation, or demolition site; building supplies can be delivered to a site in a skip that is later used to remove waste.

Council has allocated skip bins/ containers in various open spaces and areas in town in order for the residents to large waste material and litter inside the bin and not outside the skip bin.
